

**GOOD THINGS COMING TO THEATRES OF ST. JOHN**

**AZARO'S COMING STIRS MUSICLOVERS**  
Famous Spaniard Assured of Brilliant Audience Wednesday.

Senor Hipolito Azaro, the Barcelona tenor, will give the people of St. John a close-up of Caruso's closest rival on the operatic stage and his unquestionable equal in the musical world. This happy state of affairs has been brought about by accident, due to the cancellation of Anna Case's contract with Louis LeLacheur, who had the soprano star booked to appear at the Imperial Wednesday. Because of the serious nature of the dis-appointment to the St. John promoter, two of the leading musical brokerages in New York aided by the urgency of Miss Case herself, prevailed upon Senor Azaro to take the long jump into St. John and render one of his marvelous programmes. It is therefore perfectly all right for those who have tickets for Wednesday night to rest in the assurance that they are going to hear a performer in highest favor at the very heart of things musical. As an operatic star or concert performer Azaro is one of the world's four greatest, and the expense incurred in bringing him here alone more than offsets the double cost of having had Miss Case sing in Halifax and St. John.

Interest in the musical event of Wednesday is evidenced greatly since the announcement of Senor Azaro's coming and the ticket sale indicates a splendid audience. The ticket office at the Imperial is open all day for reservations where tickets can be bought outside the Halifax engagement has been abandoned because of lack of time and also because Senor Azaro has other bookings. Mr. LeLacheur has, therefore, been forced to meet a rental expense in the sister city in addition to other extras. His efforts to prevent a disappointment in St. John will doubtless be highly commended by everyone.
