THINK BETTER TIMES SOON FOR RAILWAYS

New York, Dec. 7.—A canvass made in several of the railroad offices where officials were interviewed showed that the roads to begin to do much better after the first of the year. Since they were returned to private ownership the companies have had to use the time to find themselves and they are just beginning to do that. One of the things which is preventing the carriers from making better returns despite the increase in rates is the slump in general business. One of the railroad officials was how long the extraordinary maintenance appropriations which are now appearing in the monthly statements would continue. The answer was that just so long as the weather continued good and the companies would have large gangs of workmen out, but that with a change in the weather this extra charge would disappear. The companies—that is, most of them—look advantage of government control to get rid of the back pay item, and that is not now overhauling. Another thing is that a decided increase in efficiency is beginning to make itself felt due to the fact that the men have been given to understand that they must work for what they get now, and that the shirker will be the sufferer.

DICTATORSHIP BY THE MILITARY OVER ARMENIA

Communist Movement is Reported Spreading Swiftly—Outbreaks are Reported in Alexandropol.

Constantinople, Dec. 8.—Reports reaching this city declare the war minister of Armenia has proclaimed a military dictatorship over that country. He is said to have joined Bolshevik troops at Baku and to be advancing toward Erivan, where a Soviet government was proclaimed on December 8.

The announcement that a Soviet government for Armenia has been established, a council of peoples commissaries was constituted. It is composed of five members, including two generals.

The communist movement is reported to be spreading swiftly in Armenia and outbreaks are said to have occurred in the region of Alexandropol, which is occupied by Turkish Nationalists.

TRIBUTE OF ALLIANCE TO THE REV. W. D. WILSON

The following resolution paying tribute to the services of Rev. W. D. Wilson as chief inspector was unanimously adopted at the last meeting of the New Brunswick Alliance:

"This alliance would put on record its appreciation of the manner in which their nominee, the Rev. W. D. Wilson, has carried on his duties as chief inspector under the N. B. Provincial Protection Act."

"We consider that the people of this province were exceedingly fortunate in having at the head of this department of the government administration a man of such marked ability, sterling qualities of character, moral courage and unswerving devotion to duty, during the difficult situation presented in the early days of the enforcement of the act."

"Against the organized forces of evil he has waged a conflict so wisely and efficiently that he reflects honor both on himself and the organization which has supported him, and we are glad to know that we can at once approve and applaud his course as chief inspector."

"We congratulate the temperance people of the province on having secured Mr. Wilson as field secretary of the New Brunswick Temperance Alliance and are confident that with the added experience he has gained the cause of temperance will make new advancements under his leadership."

THREE OF CREW OF U.S. DESTROYER DROWNED

Portsmouth, R. I., Dec. 8.—Three members of the crew of the destroyer Edsall were drowned late yesterday when a motor dory from the vessel capsized. The Edsall was coaling at the naval station preparatory to proceeding to the Pacific coast.

HOW WILL STRIKE OF BUYERS END?

Too Rapid Deflation May Result in Unemployment and Hard Times.

That the most extraordinary buyers' strike ever seen is now being experienced is the opinion expressed in the December letter of the National City Bank of Chicago, which points out that the consumer strike is refusing to go on paying war prices. The evils of inflation, it is pointed out, are rapidly being overcome. At the same time there is an opinion held by many business men that prices may be forced down too rapidly.

F. W. Stewart, vice-president and general manager of the Cluett Peabody Company, Montreal, believes that the present determination of the public to break prices immediately is shortsighted and that if it continues for six months longer fifty per cent of the small retailers will be forced out of business, with thousands of unemployed walking the streets and wages lowered to such an extent that a great percentage of the same public will not be able to buy if it would.

Mr. Stewart believes that the drop in prices should be gradual and that if the adjustment is worked out intelligently in this way there need be no general unemployment, drastic reductions in wages or hard times. In some lines, he points out, like shoes, clothing and women's garments, the situation is already critical.

FOR FEDERATION OF HOSPITALS

Montreal, Dec. 8.—In urging the need for the federating and placing under one management of the general hospitals of this city, Major A. K. Haywood, superintendent of the Montreal General Hospital, addressing the Rotary Club yesterday, pointed out that this institution had handled 14,000 cases of venereal disease this year, but though the provincial government had made a grant of \$50,000 to combat the disease, until there was legislation, this effort was rather thrown away. He roundly condemned the existence of a system of a commercialized vice in this city.
