Will Construct Four New Troop Ships

New York Shipbuilding Corporation Will Also Enlarge Their Plant

New York, June 28—Details of a contract for four new troopships and extensive enlargement of the plant of the New York Shipbuilding Corporation by the addition of four mammoth ways have been given out by Charles E. Piez, vice-president of the Emergency Fleet Corporation. Each of these new ways which are in reality immense building berths, will be 100 feet wide, 700 feet long, and capable of having a boat built within them of 625 feet length. The four troopships that have been contracted for to be constructed in them, will have a deadweight tonnage of 10,000 tons. This figure, however, is misleading. Mr. Piez pointed out, because the vessels will be cut in such fine lines as in reality to represent a displacement of 22,000 tons. The contract sum, including both cost of ways and troopships, calls for \$80,000,000, of which \$10,000,000 is to be spent on the way enlargements. Work is already under way, and the keels of the ships will be laid early in 1919. It is expected to require eight to ten months to complete the vessels, which will have a high speed and be equipped with engines of 12,000 horsepower size. Three other troopships have already been contracted for, to be built at the New York Shipbuilding Corporation's yard, and the first keel will be laid soon.

GERMANS DESERT AND MAKE THEIR WAY INTO SWITZERLAND

Paris, June 28—Three barbed wire fences, one of them charged with electricity, have proved ineffectual in hindering German soldiers from deserting across the frontier into Switzerland, says a Havas despatch from Basel.

The German military authorities have attempted to remedy the evil by cancelling all leaves of absence and special privileges for soldiers halting from Alsace-Lorraine.
