- July 3rd.—The Rev. David Camelon, formerly Minister of Port Hope, inducted by the Presbytery of London to the charge of Goderich.
- 11th.—The Rev. Archibald Currie, M.A., formerly Minister of Cote St. George, inducted by the Presbytery of Toronto to the charge of Brock.
- 16th.—Mr. Daniel McGillivray, B.A., Licentiate, ordained to the office of the Holy Ministry, and inducted by the Presbytery of Perth to the charge of Brockville.
- 17th.—Mr. Elias Mullan, Student of Divinity, licensed by the Presbytery of Ottawa to preach the Gospel.
- August 14th.—Mr. Donald Fraser, M.A., Licentiate, ordained to the office of the Holy Ministry, and inducted by the Presbytery of Guelph to the charge of Priceville.
- Sept. 18th.—Mr. Elias Mullan, Licentiate, ordained to the office of the Holy Ministry, and inducted by the Presbytery of Ottawa to the charge of Richmond.
- 25th.—A new congregation organized at Lombardy and Oliver's Ferry by the Presbytery of Perth.
