"All stocks of Salt held by mercantile firms, or their agents in St. John's, at Batle Harbor, and at such other places as may hereafter be designated by proclamation, are hereby placed under the control of the Tonnage Committee of the Executive Council, and no such Salt shall be sold, delivered or otherwise dealt with except under the authority of the said Tonnage Committee.

"The violation of this Order shall be an offense triable before any magistrate; on conviction the offend er shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars and in default of payment to imprisonment not exceeding three months.


