N. S. APPLE PACKERS
WILL BE PROSECUTED.

G. H. Vroom, of Middleton, N. S., chief inspector for the maritime provinces for the department of agriculture, has been sent here to investigate existing conditions in regard to the dishonest marking of apples sent from Nova Scotia to the St. John market. Yesterday he spent in inspecting apples in the store and on the wharf as they were brought in by schooners. The result is that the statements made by E. A. Godwin a few days ago are confirmed. He said that he found that fully seventy-five per cent. of the apples examined were not what they should be. He said that there would be a number of cases of prosecution when he returned home. The apple crop of Nova Scotia for this season for foreign shipments will be, he said, 325,000 barrels, as against 275,000 last year. Within a few years he expected that Nova Scotia would be shipping half a million barrels annually.

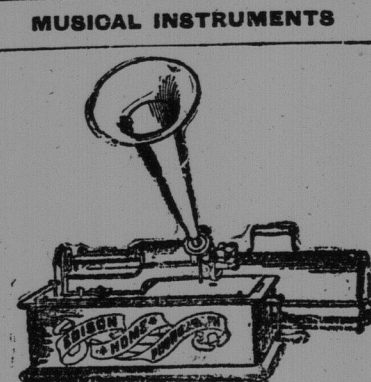
