SUMMARY NEWS.

—In the first party division in the Nova Scotia Legislature Wednesday the Fielding government was sustained, 23 to 11.

—President Grant, of Kingston, has appeared to Mayor Wright to take upon action in respect to assisting the people of Newfoundland.

—Richard Collins, of the I.C.R., Moncton, was thrown from a snow train on Thursday and one of his wrists was frightfully mangled.

—A supply of diphtheria anti-toxine has reached St. John. It was brought from Germany by Dr. J. W. Morrison for the use of the members of the St. John Medical Society.

—At Shediac, on Thursday, B. Stewart caught in a circular saw in Paul Lee's wood factory and his fingers were very badly cut. The fingers may have to be amputated.

—Sir Oliver Mowatt has been asked to establish a judiciary on Montserrat Island. At present all prisoners, even vagrants, have to be sent to Sault Ste. Marie, 111 miles away.

—Edward Drummond, a son of John Drummond, of Sussex, some years ago section foreman on the I.C.R. at Newcastle, was killed at Providence, R. I., on February 22.

—A teamster named Charles Gilles was murdered at Lathbridge, N. W. T., Wednesday night, his skull having been crushed in while in bed in his shanty. There is no clue to the murderer.

—The C.P.R. and G.T.R. have reduced the rates on flour and grain from all points in Ontario to Quebec and the Maritime Provinces. The reduction amounts to two and a half cents per 100 pounds.

—In jumping off a train at Moncton on Thursday brakeman Arthur Chisholm, of Truro, fell against some cars standing on a side track and was rendered unconscious. His injuries, it is thought, are quite serious, and he was suffering intense pain.

—The grocery and crockery store of James Anderson, at Amherst, N. S., was damaged by fire one day last week. The stock was completely ruined. The building, which was owned by Wm. Greenfield, was insured for \$1,500.

—The Manitoba Legislature opened on Thursday. A sensational feature of the opening was the resignation of Edward Dickson, the member for Luss, who had been charged with using funds of the municipality of which he was treasurer.

—Dallas T. Hyams and Harry P. Hyams, brothers, and general brokers, Toronto, were arrested on Tuesday, charged with the murder of William C. Wells, formerly bookkeeper for the firm, who was found dead and with his head crushed in in Hyams' warehouse a year ago last January. The arrest is in connection with the suspected big insurance swindle recently exposed.

—Miss Tiently, the 18-year-old girl who eloped from Liverpool, Eng., with a married man and was arrested recently on arriving in Halifax, has been spirited away from the legal grasp of her lover's counsel, who are striving to prevent her return to her father. The attorneys cannot find her and it is probable that she is in the care of an Episcopal clergyman in Halifax, who has been in cable communication with the girl's father.

R. N. P. E. L.—Have more 8 years old, not doing well. Easy try and dirty skin, some said to her bones is continually itching the wall; very low in condition. What is the matter?

Ans.—Your mare is suffering from chronic indigestion, with acidity of stomach. Feed her carefully. Mix a little lime with her drinking water. Give full doses of Manchester's Tonic Powders. After feeding one package, give pint of raw linseed oil.
