Washington, Jan. 28.—Renewals of sixteen general arbitration treaties with foreign nations were considered today by the senate foreign relations committee without action and will be again discussed tomorrow. President Wilson has urged that all the treaties be ratified by the Senate as soon as possible.

It was determined to take up first the British treaty which expired last June and was held up in the Senate because some Senators feared its ratification might force arbitration and The Hague over the Panama Canal tolls dispute. Before recommending renewal of the treaty the committee wants an understanding on what is to be done in Congress on the tolls question. That President Wilson regards the toll exemptions as a violation of the Hay-Pauncefote treaty is now generally understood and administration leaders are deliberating whether to 'Fepeal the exemption or suspend operation of its provisions pending further negotiations.


