The Times' correspondent of Beriin says there is reason to fear that the im-pending deposition of the Archbishop of Breslau may occasion delicate complica-tions in the relations of Anstria and Prussia, owing to the fact that a portion of the Archiepiscopal Diocese lies in Austrian territory. The London papers speak of the revival services yesterday at the Agricultural Hall as the most successful yet held. Advices from Calcutta in relation to the difficulties between the Indian Govern-ment and the King of Burmah concerning boundaries and other matters, state that the King is making warlike prepara-tions.

Secessions from the Catholic to the orthodox Greek Church continue on a arge scale in Russian Poland.

NEW YORK, April 5. A Havana letter quotes American Con-sul as stating that there are only 20 cases of yellow fever in the hospitals of that city. It is apprehended that the newly arriving Spanish troops will be victims of the fever as soon as they arrive.

VENICE, April 5. THE EMPEROR OF AUSTRIA arrived here this morning from Trieste. He was received by the King of Italy with royal embrace, and escorted to the
