flower of its diplomatic talent to attend the sessions of the late "peace convention" at The Hugue, and now, within a few months after the adjourument of Uncle Sam letting contracts by the whotesale for the construction of new warships and cruisers. Great Britain is doing the same thing in addition to the extraordinary increase which is
being demanded for the army. As a matter of fact there appears no good reason for helief that general disarma-
ment will take place until war becomes o expensive, both in respeet to ure and lives as to compel all nation to agree to peace as a means of sel preservation.
This condition will not arise as long s. means of offensive and defensive war are are improved in substantially an qual degree, us has thus far been the ase. In ;ther words, when someon veuts a method of destroying human an te maintained, the time will be favorable for the adoption of an universal peace agreement.
