His Powerful speech in London. His Work for the Cause of Irish Union. An Important Conference.

The following despatch, dated London, 11th August, speaks for itself and needs no comment. Hon. Edward Blake delivered a speech before a meeting of the Home Rule Union last night, which is considered on all hands to be the best he has yet made in England.
