McCoy, William Frederick, Q.C. (Shelburne, Q.C.)

B. at Lysrian, in the County of Longford, Irel., 15 May, 1840, and came to N.S. when eight years of age. Ed at Sackville Academy, N.B. M., 14 July, 1868, to Maud L., dau. of Robert P. Woodill, Esq., merchant, Shelburne, Called to the bar, N. S., in 1864, and apptd. a Q.C. 11 Oct. 1880. Practised his profession in Shelburne for nine years, when he removed to Halifax where he now practices. Was elected an Alderman for the city of Halifax in 1881. Offered the position of Attorney-General in the Liberal Goyt,, formed 3 Aug. 1882, but declined, considering that his colleague had a prior claim. An unsuccessful candidate for present seat in Leg. Assem. at g.c. 1878. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at last g.e. A Liberal. —Halifax, N.S.
