An Act to make further provision for the Geological Survey of this Province.

WHEREAS by an Act of the eighth year of Her Majesty's Preamble. Reign, chaptered sixteen, the sum of two thousand pounds annually, for five years, was appropriated for making a Geological Survey of this Province, and by an Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty's Reign, chapter 5 twelve, the said Act was revived and furthur extended for five years : And whereas the said appropriation has been found insufficient to carry on the Survey in an effectual manner, and it is desirable to make such an increase to the establishment as will hasten the completion of the undertaking and enlarge its 10 usefulness : Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows :

1. Out of the unappropriated public moneys of the Province, Appropriation a sum not exceeding five thousand pounds shall be annually for continuing 15 applied, for a term not exceeding five years from the passing the Survey. of this Act, to defray the expenses of the Geological Survey or any arrears of expenditure already incurred, which sum shall be paid at such times and in such manner as the Governor in Council may direct, subject to the provisions hereinafter made.
