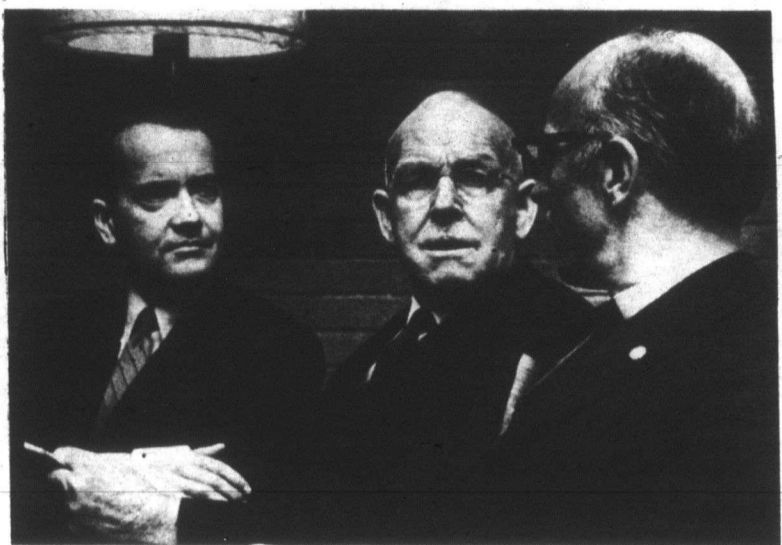

Municipalities no longer effective, says Bailey

Municipalities must become involved with regional government planning, a CORDC workshop seminar was told last week.

Over 70 representatives of municipal councils from Peel, Halton, York and Ontario counties attended.

CORDC president Brian Bailey said: "There must be a degree of acceptability in any regional government proposal."

He said a regional unit could not be limited by either geography or population.

Mr. Bailey said a municipality was no longer effective today unless it had a sound economic base and was able to support basic engineering, planning and administrative staff.

DIFFICULT

Only a few existing municipalities could cope with development problems and no real planning was being carried out, he maintained.

Dr. R.S. Thoman, director of the regional development branch for the Province of Ontario, outlined the stages in the regional government program proposed for Ontario.

He said completion of the

program could take as little as another three or four months.

One of the proposals would merge Peel and Halton counties.

Under that scheme the towns of Port Credit and Streetsville would merge with Mississauga to form one local government unit.

The two county councils would be replaced with a regional authority.
