necessary that the Commissioner should without loss of time proceed to the locality and deal with the disaffected Indians. The Commissionerseem to have accomplished their work with signal success. They succeeded in allaging the fears and calming the discontent efsting among the Indians and effectually broke up, for she time at least, the dangerous and wide spread confederacy existing among the Sushward and Othawa. - gon Indians in the South Hestern portion of the Province. In dealing with their special work the adjustment of the land difficulties the commissioners appear to have exercised great judgment, tack fimmes and pature, desposingof the many complicated questions upon which they had to adjuscute, questions moolving frequently conflicting claims of Indians and white settlers, in such a manner as to give general sabisfaction to all the parties interested. mand the Commissioners would seem to have gained the confidence and good will of all the Indian Communities with which they have come in coutact and the neighbouring Indian Tribes whom they have not yet visited are andiously looking forward to their advent amongst them.
