Dear Mr. Rivard:

I appreciate very much your letter of the 15th November. As yet I have not heard from Mr. Asselin or any other with the affidavits which I so desire. I do hope they will come shortly. You may remember just toward the end of the Rimouski campaign I sent a telegram that I was informed Messrs Lapointe; Cannon; and I think another had made statements to the effect that I was responsible, in the absence of Mr. Doherty, Minister of Justice, for the raid on the Guelph Novitiate in January, 1918, and making denial of these statements and giving reasons why it could not be true. I would like to get the newspaper report or something else confirming the fact that one or two of these men made such statements. I think probably Mr. Gagnon could send me this. Would you ask him to.

So sorry not to see you in Toronto. It was really a wonderful event.

Do not be discouraged as to West Hastings. Local conditions there were adverse, but this will not occur again and
