end of the Rimouski campaign I sent a telegram that I was
informed Messrs Lapoints; Cannon; and I think another had
made statements to the effect that I was responsible,
in the absence of Mr. Doherty, Minister of Justice, for
the raid on the Guelph Movitiate in January, 1918, and making
denial of these statements and giving reasons why it could
not be true. I would like to get the newspaper report or
something else Confirming the fact that one or two of these
men made such statements. I think probably Mr. Gagnon could
send me this. Would you ask him to.

So sorry not to see you in Toronto. It was really a wonderful event.,
