It is an awful mark of deadness, men can sin with ease. If we were fully alive, we she shrink back in horror from every wilful disregard to holy will of God.

And this condition of death is the natural state of all. Spiritual things make no impression upon us, awaken in us no interest. We are very much alive the world of sense. We can talk fluently of business politics, of social affairs, and even of the external religion. But when the subject is the inner life, relations to God and the life to come, we are sile
