There are, according to the 1913 census, 2,128,531 sheep in Canada, shearing in the neighborhood of about 13,840,000 pounds of wool. This number represents but a small measure of what Canada's resources will permit in sheep production.

With its boundless areas of undeveloped land, why should Canada be under the necessity of importing its supply of wool and mutton when sheep can undoubtedly be raised with profit not only in connection with mixed farming but as well under conditions where cultivation of the land or the grazing of other animals is impossible?
