Pupils remaining at the College during the Christmas vacation will not be allowed to visit friends, unless they are authorized by their respective parents or guardians.

Parents and guardians will receive a semi-annual Bulletin of the health, application, progress, etc., of their children. A monthly Bulletin will be sent on demand.

Means of Emulation: The principal means of emulation are notes, competitions and examinations. Notes for classes are given twice a month and are relative to lessons, exercises and conduct. Notes on lessons and exercises have an absolute value and are not based on the presumed application of the pupils, but on the efficient result of their work.

Notes for study and general discipline take in *religious* conduct, application in the study hall, behaviour during study, in the ranks, refectory, dormitory, etc., and also politeness and general deportment.

Notes are expressed by figures as follows: 6, perfect; 5, very good; 4, good; 3, middling; 2, bad; 1, very bad.

Public proclamation, reports to the parents or guardians, immunities, marks of merit, Table of Honor, such are the principal sanctions consequent upon notes.

Printed bons points are distributed in accordance with particular rules established for the purpose. Honor premiums are awarded at the end of the year—in each division—to the three students whose conduct during the year has been the most satisfactory.

Competitions in the most important branches of study are held in all classes twice a month. The Rev. Father Superior proclaims the result in each class and distributes a ribbon of merit to the first and bons points to the first and second. Premiums are awarded at the end of the year, in accordance with the general result of these competitions.
