So it was carried in the affirmative by a majority of eighteen.

The main question as amended being put, it was agreed unto by the House.

RESOLVED, That this House will, upon Wednesday next, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House on the said Bill.

A Bill to amend part of an Act paffed in the fortieth year of His Majefty's reign, Chap. 8th, intituled, "An Act to prevent harbouring runaway Scamen, to repeal certain parts of An Act or Ordinance therein mentioned, and for other purpofes."—was read for the fecond time.

On motion of Mr. James Cuthbert, feconded by Mr. Perinault,

ORDERED, That the faid Bill be committed to a Committee of the whole Houfe.

RESOLVED, That this Houfe will, to-morrow, refolve itfelf into a Committee of the whole Houfe upon the faid Bill.

And then on motion of Mr. Lees, feconded by Mr. Vigé,

The Houfe adjourned.

THE Honorable Mr. Justice De Bonne, with the other meffengers, reported, that according to order, they had waited upon His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor with the address of this House of Saturday last, who was pleased to fay that he would comply therewith.

The order of the day for the Houfe to refolve itfelf into a Committee of the whole Houfe, upon the report of the Committee on the Bill to amend an Ordinance paffed in the 25th year of the reign of His prefent Majefty, intituled, "An Ordinance to regulate the proceedings in "the Courts of Civil Judicature, and to establish Trials by Juries in "actions of a Commercial nature, and perfonal wrongs to be compenfated in damages," being read—On
