

So it was carried in the affirmative by a majority of eighteen.

The main question as amended being put, it was agreed unto by the House.

RESOLVED, That this House will, upon Wednesday next, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House on the said Bill.

A Bill to amend part of an Act passed in the fortieth year of His Majesty's reign, Chap. 8th, intituled, "An Act to prevent harbouring run-away Seamen, to repeal certain parts of An Act or Ordinance therein mentioned, and for other purposes."—was read for the second time.

On motion of Mr. *James Cutkbert*, seconded by Mr. *Perinault*,

ORDERED, That the said Bill be committed to a Committee of the whole House.

RESOLVED, That this House will, to-morrow, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House upon the said Bill.
