Mr. President, and Gentlemen of His Majesty's Council,

Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly:-

I shall rely upon your assiduous exertions to expedite the public business as much as possible, and I make no doubt but you will agree with me in the necessity of putting the Province into such a respectable state of defence as shall ensure its security against any attack which may be meditated against it.—This necessary duty performed, I shall have great pleasure in releasing you from further attendance for the present.

On motion, ordered, That Mr. Robie, Mr. Ritchie, Mr. Archibald, Mr. Marshall and Mr. Haliburton, be a Committee to prepare an answer to His Excellency's Speech.

James Lent, Esq. Member for the County of Shelburne, took his Seat, having previously taken the usual oaths, and subscribed the usual declaration, at the table of the House, in the presence of the Honorable James Stewart, one of the Commissioners appointed by his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.

Then the House adjourned until To-morrow, at ten of the clock,
