The Bill was accordingly read a second time; and referred to a Select Committee, composed of Mr. Bown, Mr. Blanchet, Mr. Parker, the Honorable Mr. Abbott, Mr. Morris, Mr. Dunkin, Mr. Cameron (North Ontario), Mr. Pâquet, and the Honorable Mr. Attorney General Macdonald, to report thereon with all convenient speed; with power to send for persons, papers and records.

The Order of the Day for the second reading of the Bill to define the powers of the Commissioner of Crown Lands in relation to Surveys and the construction of Colonization Roads, and for other purposes, being read;

Órdered, That the said Órder be discharged.

Ordered, That the Bill be withdrawn.

The Order of the Day for the second reading of the amendments made by the Legislative Council to the Bill, intituled, "An Act to amend chapter twenty-six of the Consoli-"dated Statutes for Lower Canada, in so far as it relates to certain Water-courses," being read; The said amendments were accordingly read a second time, and agreed to.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry back the Bill to the Legislative Council, and acquaint their Honors, that this House hath agreed to their amendments.

The House, according to Order, again resolved itself into a Committee on the Bill to amend and consolidate the several Acts respecting the Municipal Institutions of Upper Canada.

And the House having continued to sit in Committee until after Twelve of the Clock on Thursday morning;

Thursday, 9th August, 1866.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and the Honorable Mr. Cameron (Peel) reported, That the Committee had gone through the Bill, and made amendments thereunto. Ordered, That the Report be received, at the next sitting of this House.

Then, on motion of the Honorable Mr. Attorney General Macdonald, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Attorney General Cartier,

The House adjourned.
