Adjourned till 9 o'clock to morrow morning.

WEDNESDAY, August 12th, 1812.

THE House met pursuant to adjournment. - PRAYERS.

The order of the day being read, Mr. Speaker left the Chair, the Houle refolved itfelf into a Committee of the whole Houle (Mr. Goff in the Chair) to take into confideration the internal defence of the Colony, and after fome time fpent therein, the Speaker refumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported progrefs and begged leave to fit again to-morrow, which was ordered.
