THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba. Saskatchawan on Alberta 18 35.000: market week. duarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub Agency), on certain conditions.

A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. London, Dec. 13.-The new issue of "Debretts Peerage," the official annual record of British titles, strikingly illustrates how the aristocracy has suffered through the war. A roll of honor of some eight hundred names is given of those killed in battle or who have died of wounds, fill-

ing twelve pages. The list contains the names of one member of the royal family, 6 peers, sixteen baronets, six knights, seven "God, Being Almighty and members of the House of Commons, 164 companions of various orders, 95 Loving, Spared Us," He sons of peers, 82 sons of baronets, and 84 sons of knights. Changes in succession to more than one hundred titles thus have been caused.
