RECORD IS **SMASHED**

Dawson Does the Round Trip to Whitehorse

In Four Days and Eighteen Hours -Light and Barge From Lower River.

The steamer Dawson is today the king pin of the upper river fleet as far as the round trip record is concerned. On her last up trip she left Dawson at 1.12 p.m. last Monday, arriving at Whitehorse at 3:50 p.m. Thursday, 3 days, 2 hours and 38 minutes. At 10:40 the same evening she had her cargo aboard and cast off her lines for Dawson, arriving here at 7:50 this mora ng, making the run down in 33 hours and 10 minutes. The total time consumed from the time she left her Dawson dock until her return was 4 days 18 hours and 38 minutes, the best time ever made so far on the round trip.
