To His Excellency the Governor General in Council:—

The petition of the undersigned loyal residents of the Dominion of Canada sheweth:

That the International Bible Students' Association is composed of law-abiding persons and devout Christians, who are seeking the Truth by honest interpretation of the Scriptures.

That the "Bible Student's Monthly," and the "Finished Mystery" are works of religious instruction used by the International Bible Students, and in no respect whatever seditious or objectionable from a national standpoint. That thru error or misrepresentation, the publication and possession of these works have been prohibited by the government of Canada.

That in the interest of religious liberty, free speech, and the best traditions of British citizenship, the said ban should be lifted.

Your petitioners therefore pray that the said ban be lifted and the free circulation of the said works again permitted in Canada.

RED TRIANGLE FUND WARD MEETING.

An important meeting of the residents of Ward 4 is called for Tuesday afternoon, April 23rd at 2 o'clock in Woodville Hall to effect an organization of the Ward for the canvas of every home for the Military Y. C. A. fund of which Kings County morally is obligated to raise its proportion of the \$2,500.00 Canada has pledged.

Dr. H. T. DeWolfe, Captain Kneal, & County Organizer, Mr. George Chase, are expected to be present and address the meeting.

Ward 4 appears to be the first district in the County to call such a meeting, and shows the keen interest of the residents in the welfare of our boys at the front, and their determination to support this cause in the practical way such a service merits.

At the convocation of the Presbyterian College, Halifax, this week, Rev. R. B. Layton expects to receive the degree of B. D. A candidate in Arts, for this degree must be graduate and must make first class Honors in examination through out his whole College course, and then reach the same standard on five subjects in a special examination taken at least one year after graduation. This is to be followed by the writing of three Theses or approved subjects. Having fully qualified on all these points, Mr. Layton's name will be placed before the Senate on Wednesday with the recommendation that the degree be conferred. There has been 42 of these degrees given since the College opened in 1820, and it is the highest conferred for scholarship only.

The death occurred on Sunday morning at his home in the Gore, Hants Co. of Private Aubrey Murphy. He had been a patient at the Sanatorium for several months, and left there on April 4th for his home. There being no minister at present in charge of that congregation, the family asked Mr. Layton to take charge of the funeral on Tuesday, Mr. Layton left on Monday, and will probably not return before Friday.
