It is evident that there will be no new bridge over the Thames at Fifth new bridge over the Thames at Fifth street this year.

In the recent conflict between the Council and the Railway Company, both parties played their hands without success. The Council were resolute and the Company were determined. Each side refused to enter into any proposition or scheme that would not be of material benefit to themselves, and, as no happy medium selves, and, as no happy medium could be struck, the matter was dropped. It was thought, at the time, that the Railway Company would not make any further efforts would not make any further efforts to secure the city's co-operation in replacing the present shaky structure with a new and up-to-date bridge, as the Council had clearly shown that any attempt to obtain more than \$10,000 from the city would prove a failure, and so, as the Railway Company do not feel like supplying Chatham with a new bridge, at great expense to themselves, they have decided to strengthen the present one and make it do, until such time as the city can amicably combine with them in the matter.

they can obtain the bonus of \$35,000 due to them from the city, and it is only reasonable that they should proceed with the strengthening work as soon as possible, in order to obtain this bonus.

They have made it public that they have no money to continue the line to the Lake Shore or to make any improvements on present running road, and that their hands are tied until they receive the bonus, so that it will not come as a surprise to anyone to hear that the Company will one to near that the Company want submit plans for strengthening the present bridge, to the Railway Committee of the City Council, during the next few days and that a meeting will be called immediately on their receipt to consider these propositions.


