OBITUARY

JAMES P. HOWLEY, F.G.S.

Mr. James P. Howley, F.G.S., director of the Newfoundland Geological Survey, passed away at his home, 15 Military Road, at 4 o'clock yesterday morning. His illness was brief. Monday Mr. Howley was in apparent good health, and did not prepare to retire until 11 o'clock. While en. gaged in night prayer he was taken suddenly ill and became un. conscious. A doctor was called, who quickly responded, and also a priest. All that medical skill could devise was availed of, to no purpose, and the end came peace. fully a few hours after the New Year had been ushered in. De. ceased was in his 71st year, hav. ing been born in this city July 7th, 1847.

For more than a half a century Mr. James P. Howley has been connected with the public service, having entered the Colonial Sec. retary's Office when a young man. In 1867 he was appointed assistant Geological Surveyor, which posi. tion he held for twenty years. In 1897, upon the death of Alexander Murray, C.M.G., Mr. Howley was appointed Chief of the Geological Department, and director of Gov. ernment surveys, which position he held up to the time of his death. The greater part of his official life was devoted to the topograph. ical and trigonometrical survey of Newfoundland and study of the geological features of the island. He was engaged at the revision of a most useful and exhaustive published report of his work at the time the summons came which was to remove from the city a scholarly gentleman whose valu. able services to his native land are writ large in our colonial history. No man possessed a more minute and detailed knowledge of the re. sources of the Colony, and no one held greater belief in the capabili. ties of its productiveness, and par. ticularly as to its coal-bearing areas. In 1877 Mr. Howley pub. lished a short geography of New. foundland, which was the standard geography in school use for many years, while he also published many reports, pamphlets and let. ters embodying valuable informa. tion. He was also curator of New. foundland's Court at the Festival of Empire in Crystal Palace, Lon. don, England. The late Sir Caven. dish Boyle, when Governor of the Dominion referred to the deceased as "A man of untiring zeal in the public service." He was truly one of nature's noblemen.
