THE PRINCE IN IRELAND. Creat Excitement Throughout the Emer-

A RUCTION AT MALLOW. London, April 13. - There was a terrible row at Mallow junction, county Cork, this afternoon on the arrival of the Prince and Princess of Wales from Dublin on their way to visit the Earl of Lis towel at Cavanmore. A large crowd broke through the police lines and were driven back at the point of the bayonet. Messrs. O'Brien, Redmond and Harrington, Irish members of parliament, wer in the crowd and were badly mauled. Ever since the riot the government has monopolized the telegraph wires and no further details are obtainable. The news of the disturbance caused intense excite

ment in the house of commons. The chief organizer of the demonstration to the prince at Mallow, was O'Brien, M. P., editor of United Irecand. In an interview this evening, O'Brien said: "My object is accomplished. I have shown the special reporters who accompany the Prince of Wales the true Irish view of his visit, and have vindicated Ireland's name by showing its inhospitality to intruders.
