**RITOLA BIG EXPENSE TO U. S. AMATEUR BODY.**  
Expect Reinstatement.  
NEW YORK, Feb. 27.—Willie Ritola, the Finnish runner, is expected to be reinstated by the National A.A.U. within the next 24 hours, after an expensive process of voting on the matter. A telegram of 600 words was sent to each member of the National Registration Committee, stating the complaint of a Boston promoter, who accused Ritola of unethical conduct, and setting forth Willie's reply. Furthermore, at the expense of the A.A.U., Hugo Quist, Ritola's adviser, ran up two hours of long distance tolls explaining the circumstances to distant members of the registration committee.

**HOLLAND MAY NOT HOLD OLYMPICS—GOVT. FIGHTS APPROPRIATION.**  
PARIS, Feb. 28.—A despatch to Le Matin from Amsterdam says the bill introduced by the Dutch Government appropriating 1,000,000 florins for the expenses of the 1928 Olympic Games, is meeting with such opposition in the Chamber of Deputies, that its rejection is anticipated. In this case, it is added, the Dutch Olympic Committee would be unable to organize the games at Amsterdam.

AMSTERDAM, Feb. 27.—The Cabinet, after debating the celebration in Holland, of the 1928 Olympic Games, in accordance with a decision of the International Olympic Committee, is a matter of international honor, may make the voting of the 1,000,000 florins necessary for the organization of the games a question of confidence.
