PROPOSED NEW-POLITICAL PARTY.

On Saturday evening a meeting of young men was held in the Agricultural Hall, Toronto, for the purpose of hearing the views of those who maintain that a new political party is now called for. The hall was crowded with a very respectable body of young men. Although during the evening they made a great deal of noise, in other respects good order was preserved, no one seeming to lose temper.

The first resolution affirmed the ne-The first resolution affirmed the necessity for the cultivation of a Canadian national sentiment which would more closely unite the people of the various provinces and promete mutual confidence, and for drawing the line between Canadians loyal to their soil and those whose citizenship was a secondary matter to them.

It was also resolved—That this meet-It was also resolved—Inat this meeting approves of the objects of the Canadian National party, and pledges them its support in the formation of a political organization throughout the Dominion, whose aim shall be the development of a

whose aim shall be the development of a national sentiment, the destruction of sectionalism, and which shall legislate in the interests of the whole country, irrespective of either of the axisting political parties."

The third resolution expressed an opinion that the discussion was called at an inopportune time, as tending to raise the suspicion that it was called to create political capital for one party at the expense of the other.

All the resolutions were carried, and an amendment pledging the meeting to support Mr. Moss, on the ground that he was in sympathy with the objects of the national party, was voted down.
