

The mother must have taken them one by one from bed as they were sleeping, immersed each one in the water until dead, and then laid it on the bed. When the

awful work was done she tried to drown herself. She was taken to the hospital. A note she had written, which was found on the table, contained the words: "My husband is alone to blame, has driven us to death." Soon after the tragedy was known the man returned with a dealer, and when he heard of his children's death he coolly proceeded to bargain with the dealer for the sale of the household chattels. The brute was arrested. His wife must stand her trial as a murderess. while no charge can be levied against him but one of negligence and bru-tality.
