Local Market Quotations.

The grain market during the week just closed has been moderately active, with good receipts and a steady demand for all kinds. The bulk of the offerings were wheat, and the price paid was \$1.00 for red and \$1.05 for white. Some sales of red were made as low as \$1.00, and others up to \$1.05. In the case of the highest making the whole range \$1.00 to \$1.05. Sales of white were mostly at \$1.00, and the highest paid was \$1.05, the lowest \$1.00. Receipts only moderate.

Barley sales were few; \$1.00 to \$1.05 were the ruling values. Oats were freely offered and sold at \$1.00 to \$1.05. Corn sold at \$1.00 when dry and at \$1.05 when damp. Some small lots of really wet were sold at \$1.00.

Buckwheat was scarce and sold at \$1.00 per cwt for a small lot. Orie offered, price quoted for last transaction.

White beans sold at \$1.10 to \$1.15 per bushel, the latter price for strictly hand picked. Oats were sold at \$1.00 to \$1.05 per bushel. Corn sold at \$1.00 to \$1.05 per bushel. Buckwheat was scarce and sold at \$1.00 per cwt for a small lot. Orie offered, price quoted for last transaction.

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
