### THE FIGHT WITH GEN. DELAREY'S FORCE.

Graphic Details of One of the Greatest Battles of the South African Campaign.

Pretoria, Oct. 10.-Details of the fight between the British troops under Col. Kekewich and 1,500 Boers under Commandants Delarey and Kemp, near Selous River, have just arrived. The British camp had evidently been carefully chosen. It lay in a triangle formed by the river on the west, a donga on the east, and the Zeerust-Rustenberg road on the south. The northern apex of the triangle. The banks of the river are deep and precipitous, and the country road is

During the night the Boers crept noiselessly up the river bed, and by making a debouchment of the donga, obtained a partial command of the apex of the triangle and the western

A patrol of Yeomanry, which was sent to reconnoiter to the west, crossed the drift, but were driven back by the Boers, who were between them and the British camp. After going through the Yeomanry, the Boers attacked the pickets who were holding the river. A British officer of the Chase was the first man killed. The age ...... 5c men made a heroic and costly resist-

The next picket to the south was defended by some of the Derbyshires, who held out until all were killed or The Scottish Horse picket, A very complete stock of Hurd's was within the apex of the river and donga, fought magnificently and held their own.

All the men, the Scottish Horse and Derbyshires, Yeomanry and artillery Envelopes, per package....... 25c unhesitatingly sprang into action, formed a firing line facing west, and checked the Boers, who were nearly into the British lines.

TURNED THE BOER FLANK. A portion of the Derbyshires was then sent from the south to repel an attack which was anticipated from the east. They wheeled right around the camp, and arrived without much opposition northeast of the point where the donga joins the river. Here they formed in line with the Scottish Horse and thus outflanked the Boers' left. Then the Scottish Horse these Derbyshires charged the river and donga with fixed bayonets. and with an irriesistible rush cleared the Boers out.

Meanwhile the remaining Derby

shires on the British left and the Yeo-manry made a similar rush on the Proer by the drift, and sent the Boers to the left of the river. At the beginning of the fight the fir-ing was so hot that it was impossible

to use the British artillery, but when the Boers began to retreat the guns rendered effective work. A Maxim gun was served fearlessly by nine of the Derbyshires, all of whom were killed or wounded. All the men fought as they had been instructed and directed. There were numerous instances of heroism on the part of the British officers and men. After Col. Kekewich had been hit he got up and stood by the guns, refusing to take cover, and encouraged and directed all his men. The flank movement of the Derbyshires showed the remarkably cool direction of the fight.

The Boers lost heavily especially in the final charges. They asked permission to remove their dead, and a lull ensued while both sides were engaged in this work. The Boers carried numbers of their dead off in nets between their horses. It is estimated that fully 300 of the enemy were slain.

It is said that the Boers were greatly disheartened at the outcome of supplies and ammunition instead of being repulsed. Boer prisoners say they expected more from this battle than from years of guerilla fighting.

### SNALLPOX IN OTTAWA

It May Be Found Necessary to Close All the Schools.

Ottawa, Oct. 11.-The Ottawa schools may be closed until the smallpox is stamped out. Dr. Law, acting medical health officer, stated yesterday that the schools should be closed for two or 'Edward VII. March' ...............5c three weeks, until all the children are vaccinated.

Inspector Glasham, of the public school board, says it would be a great mistake to do this, as it would in-crease the danger of a contagion. Sir James Grant, the dean of the medical faculty in Ottawa, says there is no cause for fear, and that the disease is so mild it is no worse than chickenpox.

Toronto, Oct. 11.-Dr. Bryce states that in the first nine months of the year 1,054 cases of smallpox have been reported in Ontario. Of these 40 are not yet convalescent, chiefly in Northern Ontario and Oxford county. Dr. Bryce urged that the Dominion Government establish an institute of scientific research that would assist disease. The doctor pointed out that smallpox in the states is increasing in virulence, and that Ontario will have to watch carefully, and to go in largely for compulsory vaccination.

MORMON LEADER DEAD.

Salt Lake, Utah, Oct. 11 .-- Lorenzo Snow, fifth president of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, better known as the Mormon Church, died unexpectedly at his private residence, the historic Bee Hive House, yesterday afternoon, after an illness that had been serious only since Wednesday. The immediate cause of his death was hypostatic congestion, superinduced by aggravated bron-

President Snow's death dissolves the first presidency, of which he was the head, his two counselors being Joseph Smith and Rudger Clawson. Until his successor shall be chosen, which may not be until the annual conference next April, the leadership of the church will devolve upon the council of twelve apostles, of which body Mr. Smith is the recognized head. Unless death should come to him in the meantime, Mr. Smith will be the next president of the church. Lorenzo Snow was 87 years of age.
