RELATING TO DOGS BE IT ENACTED by the Municipa ship of London as follows: 1.—No person owning, possessing or harbering any dog (including bitch) shall permit or suffer the same to run at large within the township unless constantly muzzled with an efficient metallic

muzzle. 2-Any county constable resident with n the said Township of London, or person or persons appointed for that purpose, may destroy any dog running at large contrary to the provisions of this bylaw. 3.—Any person convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of this bylaw shal forfeit and pay, at the discretion of the convicting justice of the peace, a penalty not exceeding fifty dollars for each of-fense, exclusive of costs, and in default of payment of such penalty and costs, of costs only, the same may be levied by distress and sale of the offender's goods and chattels, and in case of there being no distress found out of which such pen-alty can be levied, the convicting justice commit the offender to the common all of the County of Middlesex, with or vithout hard labor, for any period not xc eding twenty-one days, unless th aid penalty and costs are sooner paid.
