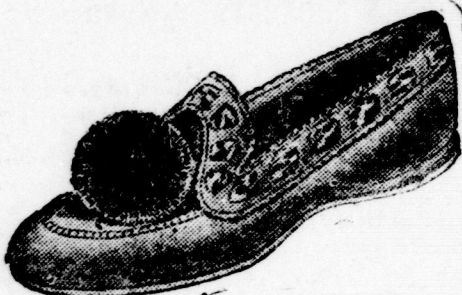

HOPES LEAGUE CAN YET SOLVE UNEMPLOYMENT

Williams Finds French Laborers Have Faith in World Covenant.

AVERTS USE OF SHELLS

Believes Worklessness of World's Workers Must Be Remedied.

Whiting Williams' last article on his "pick and shovel" investigation of industrial and economic conditions in Europe describes a session of the League of Nations assembly, viewed from a workman's standpoint.

"How do you break into this League of Nations office anyway?" My temperature was rising rapidly by the time I asked the question of a chauffeur in Geneva, last summer. I had tried to get into a very aristocratic-looking private residence. It looked in every way exactly like the League of Nations office a visitor from Canada would expect.

The first gate was locked. So was every other one. At each gate I grew warmer and warmer to think how the clerks and secretaries of the League of Nations had the nerve to take Saturday afternoon off two days before the opening of the league's second annual assembly!

"Right over there, m'sieur," was the chauffeur's answer with a stare of amazement at my ignorance.

Easy If You Know.

Then came the surprise of my life. Across the street from my private residence was a great six or seven-story hotel building. Boys with briefcases, letter-bags and telegrams were coming out and hustling away on motorcycles. "Trying to make their way in were crowded groups of gray-haired messengers, stylish women, distinguished-looking gentlemen, some in silk hats from Europe or South America, others in turbans from India and still others in fezes from Persia."

I had found the kind of league Europe has created.

Well, m'sieur, it can do no harm and it may save shooting many shells," was the way a French laborer sized it up. He and his fellow workers were not vigorously hopeful. But—

"We can work and work hard whenever we get the chance," according to a worker in a coal town. But the hope—hoping for great things and good—what we are too tired. We have hoped so long—and then had to fight so much!"

But worklessness of the world's workers is the result of world-wide unemployment. It will never be entirely remedied until it is met with world-wide, concerted remedies.

ANGUS TAYLOR WILL ENTER CIVIC RACE

Accedes To Request of Two Deputations and Will Be Nominated.

ST. THOMAS, Dec. 20.—According to the petitions of two deputations this week, both of influential businessmen and representatives of labor respectively, Angus Taylor decided today to let his name go before the people as candidate for alderman in the coming municipal elections.

Mr. Taylor was approached by a deputation a week ago, but owing to business pressure he hesitated about allowing his name to stand, until he was interviewed by two other deputations. It was pointed out to Mr. Taylor that the two years he already has served as member of the council has fitted him to give valuable service to the city next year, when many important problems will be dealt with by the city.

TWO WILL SEEK POST OF REEVE

ST. THOMAS, Dec. 20.—The coming municipal fight for the reeveship of Yarmouth Township will center around J. R. Teeple, the present deputy reeve, and Andrew Mills, a former deputy reeve. Reeve Wilson H. Willis has intimated a desire to retire from public life after several years' service in which he held practically every public position in the riding.
