charged this \$100,000 to current expenditure, but when the ministers saw the situation, notwithstanding the audit act and their declaration regarding the charging of bridge expenditure to current revenue, they passed an order-in-council transferring the item to permanent account, without any legislative authority whatever, thus lessening the current expenditure.

Instead of the claimed surplus of \$4,494, there was a very large deficit. The expenditure statement had shown a surplus of \$175,000, but the actual expenditure of \$1,255,381.92, it had not included this amount nor the interest on the London loan from July 1 to December 31, 1909, nor the \$75,000 of municipal road money collected in 1908 and expended in 1909 under the government in lieu of provincial money, nor the balance on account of Central Railway investigation, \$2,500,000 carried over to 1910, nor the unpaid bills of the board of works for work done in 1909, and the 1906 fish and game protection estimated at least \$50,000.

The real expenditure was \$1,429,123. Thus the deficit was the vast amount of \$169,525.

The Central investigation report came in a year ago. One would suppose that all the expenditures had been paid long ago, but at the end of \$2,500 is to be carried over to 1910. The only reason for carrying over the item must be to try and show a surplus.

The provincial secretary gave the alleged expenditure regarding bridges under the old and present government, but said nothing at all regarding the roads. Mr. Robinson was careful to omit the amounts expended on the roads in 1908 and 1909, charged as overdraft. Had he included these amounts, but he did not.

When appealing for votes the ministers said they would keep either Liberal or Conservative. He failed to find anywhere that they now thought a Liberal good enough. There were no Liberals on the Central Railway Commission and no Liberal investors were employed in connection with it nor the Kay administration. There was no Liberal when they wanted a commissioner in the case of Regina, Rogers, of Alberta, a respected citizen whose job a hungry Tory wanted. This government obtained office through Liberal support and now forgets its debt to these electors.

Mr. Hazen's old policy was to divide the country into electoral districts and reduce the membership of the house. He has forgotten that policy but he gerrymandered Westmorland and legislated voters out of St. John county. He should have thought of something better than mere party advantage. 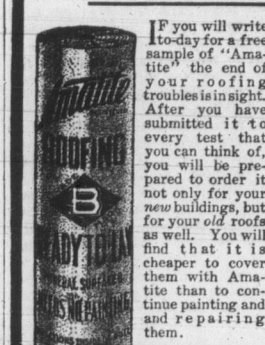
