Stanbury will go to America after the race to row William O'Connor, the American champion."

BOVING IN HAMILTON. The leaders on the Boon-A Boat crew—Toronto Must Look Out. HAMILTON, March 20.—The Spectator says that the leaders are going to boat rowing next summer and the Toronto crew will have the same snap in winning championships this year that they had last summer.
