BURNING HIS INFIDEL BOOKS.

THE most impressive instance of the power of truth on the conscience, in my memory, is that of an intelligent man who sent for me after midnight, to tell him how to be saved, and to pray for him; for he did not think he could pray for himself. He rose from his bed again and again to kneel, and though obviously dying, as indicated by his breathing, he found a key, showed me how to open a heavy trunk, and found in it a parcel of books. His look and tones I cannot forget, as he said, "They have brought my soul to the very brink of hell; they were my destruction." I kept my promise.
