NOTIFICATION EFFECTED BY AN EXCHANGE OF NOTES (MAY 17, JULY 1 AND 16, 1935) EXTENDING TO CANADA AS FROM THE 1st AUGUST, 1935, THE CONVENTION BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY AND THE PRESIDENT OF THE PORTUGUESE REPUBLIC REGARD-ING LEGAL PROCEEDINGS IN CIVIL AND COMMERCIAL MATTERS

From the Secretary of State for External Affairs of Canada to the Secretary of State for Dominion Affairs.

OTTAWA, May 17, 1935.

I have the honour to invite your attention to the Civil Procedure Convenions which have been concluded with Spain, Sweden, Norway, Poland, Italy, Justia, Portugal, Turkey and Germany, all of which have been signed and duly Atified. I have the honour to state that His Majesty's Government in Canada esire that, in accordance with the stipulations therein contained, these Conentions shall be extended to Canada by notification to the representative Overnments. Such extension might well come into force from the date of attification, or from a fixed date. In the latter event, it would be most conenient if the date could be the same in respect to all of the Conventions, and I enture to suggest that the 1st August of this year would be a satisfactory and, resumably, a practicable date. The question of dates will, of course, depend on the circumstances but, if feasible, a uniform date would be preferable.

The authorities to whom judicial and extra-judicial Acts and Commissions ogatoires are to be transmitted, will be, where action is to be taken in any Tovince in Canada, the Attorney-General of such Province; in the North West erritories, the Commissioner of the North West Territories; and in Yukon erritory, the Gold Commissioner of that Territory. The language in which munications to such authorities and translations are to be made will be aglish, except in the Province of Quebec, where they may be made either in aglish or in French. In order to insure due execution, Commissions Rogatoires

Tould contain full and complete interrogatories.

I shall be obliged, therefore, if steps will be taken to make the necessary otifications to the representative Governments.
