Mr. Olson for Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale), seconded by Mr. Sharp, moved, —That, notwithstanding the provisions of Standing Order 6 (3), on Friday, November 7, 1969, the sitting shall be suspended at 3:00 o'clock p.m., and resumed at 5:45 o'clock p.m.
