Industry, Trade and Commerce: to date there has been no financial support given under programs of the Department of Industry, Trade and Commerce for research or development of interferon. However, a number of inquiries regarding support for research and development in the general field of bio-technology, including interferon-related proposals, are currently under active consideration.

Health and Welfare Canada: no.

Medical Research Council: during the fiscal year 1979-1980 three research projects on interferon were supported. Total cost of these projects: \$129,000.

National Research Council: as part of a continuing research project an attempt is being made to see if interferon can be made by recombinant DNA techniques. Approximately \$60,000 has been spent during the current fiscal year.
