Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General by such Members of this House as are Members of the Privy Council.

The Honorable Mr. Botsford moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Dickey,

That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will be pleased to cause to be laid before this House, copies of all reports and other documents communicated to the Post Office Department by the Post Office Inspector for the Province of *New Brunswick*, as the result of that officer's investigation into the conduct of the Postmaster of *Sackville*, together with copies of any certificates of character, or recommendations in favor of such Postmaster.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative, and it was

Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General by such Members of this House as are Members of the Privy Council.

The Honorable Mr. Girard moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Sutherland,

That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, praying that His Excellency will cause to be laid before this House, copies of all instructions to the Honorable Alexander Morris, Lieutenant Governor of the North-West Territories; also copies of all Orders in Council relative to the said Territories since their organization, and not already published; also copies of all reports and official correspondence between the Lieutenant Governor and the Dominion Government from the date of his appointment.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative, and it was

Ordered, That the said Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General by such Members of this House as are Members of the Privy Council.

The Honorable Mr. *Ryan* presented to the House a Petition from the Dominion Board of Trade, praying that the manufacturing industries of the Dominion may be protected from the severe competition of American manufacturers, as well as from the systems of granting bounties, or drawbacks equivalent to bounties, by foreign nations on the exportations of manufactured articles to this Dominion.

The said Petition was, by leave of the House, then read.

Ordered, That the same do lie on the Table.

The Order of the Day being read for the second reading of the Bill initialed "An Act to remove doubts respecting the validity of certain elections in the Province "of *Quebec*,"

On motion of the Honoral le Mr. Penny, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Letellier de St. Just, it was

Ordered, That the same be postponed until Monday next.

Then, on motion of the Honorable Mr. Hamilton (Kingston), seconded by the Honorable Mr. Montgomery,

The House adjourned.
