My dear Mrs. Wheatley:-

I am sorry that I have taken so long to acknowledge your letter of April 24th, but I took the matter up with the Bank authorities shortly after its receipt.

The Bank will keep your request in mind, but it is not always convenient to move members of the staff from one place to another in order to meet the wishes of families concerned. From what I can learn your son was moved from Victoria largely because it was thought a change would do him good. I almost feel like advising you, Mrs. Wheatley, that if you insist on your son being with you in Victoria, it would probably be best for him to leave the Bank. The clerks who progress the most rapidly and who rise to the highest positions are the ones who shew themselves most willing to conform to whatever the Bank deems to be in its own best interest.

I am sorry I cannot give you any great amount of encouragement, but those in charge of transfers say they will keep the matter of his transfer in mind.
