It is used by Professionals and Amateurs in all parts of the United States and Dominion of Canada, the increased demand having become enormous and reaching thousands of dozens annually. Those desiring Balls without the accustomed 1 oz. moulded rubber, may have them by sending to us direct. Unless stamped "no rubber," it is made the same as for years gone by, with 1 oz. moulded rubber and finest woollen yarn, and sewed with the double safety lock stitch that will not rip until worn out.
