An Act to provide for the conveyance of Legislators and Judges free of charge over Railways.

W HEREAS the construction and development of the rail-Preamble.

way system of Canada has been aided greatly by liberal grants and subsidies of public moneys and of public lands, and by concessions of privileges at the public expense; and whereas it is just and right that legislators and judges when travelling in the pursuance of their functions or in the execution of their public duties, should be carried free of charge over lines of railway subject to the legislative authority of the Parliament of Canada: Therefore Her 10 Majesty, by and with the consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

- 1. In this Act, under the context otherwise requires, the Interpretaexpression "Railway Company" means:
 - (a.) The Minister of Railways and Canals;

- 15 (b.) Any lessee of any railway vested in Her Majesty as a public work of Canada;
 - (c.) Any contractor working passenger trains upon any railway in course of construction as a public work of Canada;

Every person or company, the owner or lessee of, or party to an agreement for working the railway of any company subject to the legislative authority of the Parliament of Canada, and any contractor working passenger trains upon any railway in course of construction for any such 25 person or company.
