PHILIP VAN CORTLANDT, JR.—Ensign in his father's Battalion, the Third, July 31st, 1779.

MALCOM WILMOTT.—Ensign in the Third Battalion after October 25th, 1782.

JOHN WOODWARD, of quaker parentage, living in Monmouth county. But he abjured the faith which is opposed to "warrings and fightings," and we find him as an ensign in the First Battalion August 14th, 1781. He died in the Province of New Brunswick in the year 1805.

ROBERT WOODWARD.—Commissioned an ensign in the Third Battalion December 19th, 1781, and remained therein until peace was declared and the New Jersey Volunteers disbanded.
