The Executive of the Canadian Club of Halifax has the honour to submit for the information of their fellow eitizens in Canada and throughout the British Empire beyond the seas, as follows:—

1. The Canadian Club of Halifax, in a spirit of wide patriotism, undertook to erect a Memorial Tower within the precincts of the City, for the purpose of commemorating the origin of representative government in Halifax, the Capital of Nova Scotia, and all the benefits which have sprung from it.

2. On behalf of the Club, His Honour the Lieut-Governor of Nova Seotia, laid the foundation stone of the Memorial Tower, on an ideal site, in a pleasant Park of one hundred aeres, on the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the day upon which the first Provincial Assembly was opened at Halifax.

3. The Club has collected funds for the creetion of the proposed commemorative Tower, as originally designed, and its crection may now be proceeded with. It has, however, been trought to the attention of the
